Boat Tours & Cruises

City Cruises Gananoque (6 Water St, Gananoque)

- 1-hour and 3-hour cruise options through the islands
- 5-hour Boldt Castle tour includes 2 hours to explore the castle and grounds

- Onboard bar and snacks available

City Cruises Ivy Lea (95 Ivy Lea Rd, Lansdowne)

- Convenient location near Watermark (15 min drive)

- Open 7 days/week, 8:00 AM – 6:00 PM (extended summer hours)

Peck's Marina (Near Ivy Lea Bridge)

- Close to Watermark Cottages
- Fishing boat and pontoon boat rentals
- Launch ramp available
- Gas dock and full marina services

Historic Attractions

1000 Islands Tower (Hill Island)

- 400-foot observation tower with 360° views
- Three viewing decks overlooking Canadian islands and St. Lawrence
- Knowledgeable staff at the top to answer questions
- Gift shop on-site
- Hours: 10 AM – 4 PM daily

1000 Islands History Museum (125 Water St, Gananoque)

- Free admission by donation
- Beautiful exhibits on Thousand Islands history
- Extraordinary model ships
- Friendly staff with guided tours available
- Hours: Tue-Sat 10 AM – 4 PM (closed Sun-Mon)

Thousand Islands Boat Museum (125 Water St, Gananoque)

- Guided tours of preserved luxury boats
- Learn about St. Lawrence River boat building history
- Boatshop Café on-site for refreshments

Outdoor Recreation

Parks & Beaches

Joel Stone Heritage Park (125 Water St, Gananoque)

- Beautiful waterfront park with walking paths
- Small beach and splash pad for children
- Playground and amphitheater
- Open 24 hours

Confederation Park (10 King St E, Gananoque)

- Sculpture park with water fountain
- Picnic tables and benches
- Wildlife viewing (herons, turtles, groundhogs)
- Perfect for photos on the bridge over Gananoque River

Charleston Lake Provincial Park (148 Woodvale Rd)

- 30 minutes from Watermark
- Hiking trails with varied difficulty levels

- Swimming, paddling, fishing
- Rock formations and geology exhibits
- No-motor boat areas for quiet paddling

Landon Bay Centre (302 Thousand Islands Pkwy)

- Close to Watermark (just down the parkway)
- Donovan Trail with Thousand Islands lookout
- Easy to moderate hiking
- Parking: \$6 for 12 hours (cash or credit envelope system)

Grays Beach Lookout (1000 Islands Parkway)

- Small beach right off the parkway
- Quick stop for a dip (recommend water shoes)
- Benches and picnic spot

Thousand Islands National Park

- 21 islands with camping, hiking trails, and docking
- Accessible by kayak, canoe, or boat
- Mooring permits required (available at islands)
- Camping: \$15.70/night per site (some reservable, some first-come)

Arts & Entertainment

Thousand Islands Playhouse (185 South St, Gananoque)

- Professional theatre on the waterfront
- Broadway-quality productions and musicals
- Wine, beer, and concessions available
- Hours: Tue-Sat 11 AM – 4 PM (performance times vary)

Planning Tips

Best Times to Visit

- Peak season: July-August (busy boat traffic, warm weather)
- Quieter months: June and September (less crowded, pleasant temperatures)
- Fall colors: Late September-early October (stunning scenery)

Booking Recommendations

- Book boat tours and kayak rentals in advance during peak season
- Make restaurant reservations, especially for fine dining
- Check weather forecasts before water activities
- Island camping permits can be reserved or first-come, first-served

What to Bring

- Water shoes for rocky beaches
- Sunscreen and sun protection
- Light jacket for boat tours (can be windy on water)
- Camera for stunning scenery
- Binoculars for wildlife viewing (eagles, herons, turtles)
- Cash for some parking areas and small vendors
